



How much does it cost to live at Homesdale Care Home?

These fees are valid between 1st April 2024 and 31st March 2025 and are reviewed annually.

The Registered Manager will assess you prior to admission to ensure Homesdale can meet your needs and offer the level of care required.

We accept those are **paying for their own care (self-funders)**, those who are being **supported by the Local Authority** and those in receipt of **Continuing Healthcare (CHC)** funding.



Our fees

Our fees are charged per person, per week. We do not require a deposit and we do not require a guarantor. This will include the provision of personal care, food and drink (including snacks), heating, lighting, equipment, laundry, insurance of personal items (except individual items worth more than £1,000), and in-house activities.

What's not included in your fees

At Homesdale we offer some services which are not covered by your weekly fees but we can arrange for them to be provided at a cost. You will be responsible for payment of extra items and services and we shall let you know their cost beforehand.

Extras are hairdressing, personal purchases such as stationery, confectionery, and toiletries,

newspapers and magazines, clothing including shoes and slippers, dry cleaning, the installation of private telephone line, internet or satellite TV connections (and subscription charges), and room clearance services.

Chiropody, opticians and dentistry, if not provided free by the NHS, can be provided at additional cost.

Funding arrangements

We accept those who are paying for their own care, (self-funders), and those who are being supported by the Local Authority.

Self funders

If you intend to pay your own fees, you are expected to have sufficient funds to meet the home's fees for a minimum of two years.

Local Authority Funding

If you cannot pay for your own care then you (or your representative) should approach your local social services who will arrange for a social worker to look at your care needs and financial situation and decide if you qualify for support.

As part of the arrangement with the Local Authority, you will be required to contribute

an amount towards your care from your own resources, including Pension Credit. This is an arrangement between you and the local authority and not the care home. If you are eligible for funding from your Local Authority, please speak to the Home Manager.

The Local Authority may also talk to you about top-ups. This is where the Local Authority funding does not cover the full cost of your care and a third party, for example relatives, can contribute towards the cost of your care. These contributions are called top-ups and is between you and the Local Authority, not the Care Home. You can find additional information about funding at the Citizens Advice and Age UK.
